A miniature pearlware teabowl and saucer, early 19th century, painted in blue with a chinoiserie building beneath a patterned rim, diameter of saucer 8cm, together with a small group of pottery and porcelain, including a child's toy service plate, printed in black with a girl holding a bird, diameter 8.5cm, a similar blue printed plate by Till, four feldspathic stoneware napkin rings and a Wedgwood eggcup (faults).

Condition Report

Please note - this is only a partial condition report for this lot detailing the mustard. If you require the condition of any of the other items, please request this.

Mustard - old filled/restored section to outside edge of foot beneath GR monogram, the surrounding area has been over-sprayed and this is now yellowing, there is an associated branched crack running around approx half of the actual footrim - only really visible when inverted. There are similar old yellowed spots of filling/restoration to the underside edge of both handles, approx one third of the GR monogram and an approx 2cm by 1.5cm area of the neck exterior. Otherwise typical light surface scratches and glaze blemishes overall.
