A small group of decorative porcelain, late 19th century and later, including a Royal Worcester gilt ground two-handled bonbonnière vase and cover, decorated with enamelled flower baskets within geometric border, gilt mark to base, height 15.5cm (minor restoration), a Limoges box and cover and a perfume bottle and stopper of flattened circular form, painted with birds and fruit.

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

1373 - Worcester, cover - finial restored and overgilded, body - restoration/overgilding to the interior rim at the top of the vase, fairly obvious to the edge, otherwise ok.

Moonflask - some heavy wear to gilt decoration, tiny nicks to stopper, couple of firing cracks to base.

Capodimonte hinged pot - some wear to interior gilt and exterior enamel, otherwise ok.

Gilt rectangular pot - hinges are slightly coming away from the porcelain resulting in the lid not sitting square to the base, some light wear to the gilt in places.

Cup and cover - finial re-glued, one handle cracked to bottom join with body.
