LOT 1737

A small group of early 19th century and later glassware, including two cut glass jugs, one with a strap handle, height 17cm, and two graduated Dutch water jugs, each with engraved decoration.

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1737 - Swag cut jug - there is some minor chips/flakes to rim and tiny chips to some of the swag cuts to the body, no staining or clouding, scratches to base, polished pontil. Please note engraved initials to front oval panel.

Facet cut jug - similar condition with minor nibbles to rim, otherwise ok, no staining or clouding, typical scratches to polished base.

Club shaped decanter with matched stopper - generally good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs, it is however a bit clouded and some scratches and wear. Scratches to polished base.

Other decanter and stopper (probably matched) - generally good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs, but similarly scratched and worn with some small areas of clouding, scratches to polished base.

Larger Dutch jug - generally good order, typical light surface scratches and wear, no significant damage or repairs, a little dirty and dusty but no obvious staining or clouding.

Smaller Dutch jug - small chip to spout, otherwise ok, typical light surface scratches and wear, little bit dusty and dirty but no obvious staining or clouding, both with polished bases.
