A Moore Brothers pottery dessert service, circa 1873, moulded and painted to the rim with waterlily pads and flowers, comprising twelve plates, diameter 24cm, and a comport, impressed, painted and printed factory marks, retailed by T. Goode & Co Ltd, together with a group of other decorative ceramics, including Creil et Montereau plates (faults).

Condition Report

Tazza - crack across top and some restoration to foot.

All the plates have some knife mark/scratches to glaze and typical wear.

One plate with restored chip to rim, quite obvious from underside.

Four plates appear to be in good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs.

Decoration is good and vibrant but there does seem to have been some minor professional re-touching to some of the green leaves (possibly where enamels started flaking) but done well and not immediately noticeable.

Seven plates all have some form of hairline crack, mostly with a single hairline to the rim and one with a small starcrack to centre. Typical light wear and similar re-touching to enamels in places.
