A Meissen porcelain planter or jardinière, 19th century, of wrythen moulded baluster shape on a circular foot, painted with opposing floral bouquets and scattered sprigs within basketweave moulding, the rim moulded with two shell handles, crossed swords in underglaze blue to base, height 24.5cm (restored), together with a Meissen Swan Service teacup and saucer, a Vienna figure of a girl with flowers in her apron, height 17cm, a Potschappel Carl Thieme model of a bird and two cancelled crossed swords Meissen teacups and one saucer (minor faults and restoration).

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

1571. Meissen planter - restoration to one handle and rim and restoration to footrim, otherwise ok with wear to gilt.

Bird - restored beak, otherwise ok.

Vienna girl - missing fingers to right hand and minor chips to leaves, chip to finger on right hand, otherwise good order.

Meissen swan cup and saucer - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Some wear to painting on relief swans.

Both cups and saucer in generally good order but with wear to gilt and paintwork. Typical scratches. Cancelled crossed swords mark to bases.
