LOT 601

A coral necklace, second quarter of the 19th century, formed as a graduated row of spiral decorated cylindrical batons alternating with fluted roundels, on a later base metal screw clasp, weight 53.2g, length 58.2cm, length of largest baton bead 2cm, and another coral necklace, the front with a row of eight graduated pendant drops, the circular link chain with a boltring clasp, length 48cm.

Condition Report

601. Spiral coral necklace ♦ looks as though it has been reassembled from old spiral decorated baton form divisions. There is some variation of colour and some variation of depth of spiralling. There is some variation to the width and length of the divisions as well. Three or four batons have cracks, one has been chipped and cracked. Clasp is modern.

Pendant drop necklace ♦ one coral drop missing from one end. Some variation of colour and proportion of the coral drops. The silver coloured fittings and chain would benefit from cleaning. Suggested age ♦ 1920s.
