A gold hollow curb link charm bracelet with a heart shaped padlock clasp, mounted with an oval carbuncle garnet, fitted with a variety of gold, gilt metal and other charms, including a 9ct gold motorcar, a USA gold dollar 1849, a scent bottle and a barrel, together with two loose charms, comprising a tennis racket and a slipper, total weight 81.7g.

Estimate: £600 - £900

Condition Report

745. Clasp - carbuncle garnet has a few inclusions, some surface marks, there is a chip at one side and some evidence of work around the edge of the setting. The clasp hinge opens and closes properly, the glazing at the back of the clasp has a bit of wear around the edge.

Pistol ♦ slight dent to the barrel, unmarked.

Frog ♦ silver plated base metal.

A rectangular book locket ♦ the hinge of the locket is in good condition. The edge of the front is slightly damaged. There was once white enamelled decoration between the scrollwork, this is now largely missing. Gold back and front.

Seal ♦ the yellow stone is probably paste, carved with a flower. In good condition. The top suspension is a little worn. Unmarked.

Mother-of-pearl tambourine ♦ in good condition, unmarked.

Watch key ♦ double-sided, pastes imitating cornelian and white agate. The gilding is fairly rubbed, down to base metal.

Leaping animal ♦ base metal which has been plated.

Faceted glass scent bottle ♦ top cap will not unscrew. The faceting of the glass is generally rather worn. Top unmarked but likely gold.

Gold USA dollar coin 1849 ♦ pierced with a hole.

Lily spray ♦ gold plated base metal

Motorcar ♦ hallmarked 9ct gold, Birmingham 1960

Miniature pendant locket ♦ gilt base metal. The definition to the engine turning at the back has rubbed severely with shallow denting. The hinge to the locket will open and close.

Train ♦ in good condition, unmarked, likely to be 9ct gold.

Lozenge fitting ♦ may once have been part of a dress Albert, pierced hole where something would have been attached, with an engraved monogram, unmarked, but likely to be 9ct gold.

Heart ♦ the scroll engraved decoration is a little dented, the centre of the back was probably originally a glazed hair locket this is now covered over with a gold panel. Unmarked, but likely to be 9ct.

Boy riding a barrel ♦ the back hinged door is missing, the barrel is gold coloured, the figure is silver coloured. Some signs of wear.

Spinning top ♦ looks to be silver coloured metal with applied gold coloured wire. In good condition, unmarked.

Watch key ♦ once was gold cased but this has worn away down to base metal. There may have been something mounted to the centre at some stage but this is now lacking.

Trowel ♦ the blade of the trowel was once gold plated, the handle is bone. Otherwise in good condition.

Deer ♦ gold plated base metal

Rectangular locket frame ♦ likely to be gold, unmarked. The centre originally would have had a glazed woven hair locket, this is now lacking.

Boot ♦ unmarked, the top of the boot has a hinged compartment, silver plated on a base metal, probably copper.

Circular pendant locket ♦ hinged and opens to reveal an interior glazed locket compartment, the exterior has a shallow dent to the back, gold back and front.

Brandy barrel ♦ one end it is marked ♦XXX♦, to the other end is a bloodstone seal. Unmarked, gold cased down to base metal.

Standing lion - silver plated on base metal, probably copper.

Tennis racket ♦ gold plated, possibly on silver.

Slipper ♦ gold plated, with traces of enamel.

The chain is a hollow curb link, the oval link to one end is marked ♦9c♦.

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
