### LOT 1265

A George III mahogany bracket clock with brass twin fusee movement striking quarters and hours on two bells, the anchor escapement with above bob pendulum adjustment, the backplate with engraved border, the 8-inch painted breakarch dial with strike/silent indicator to arch above Roman hour numerals and signed 'J. Lowman Ramsgate', the case with moulded arch pediment and brass carrying handle above glazed doors and sides, on a rectangular base and brass bracket feet, height 45.5cm, with pendulum (minor faults). Note: Jeremiah Lowman is a recorded clockmaker working in Ramsgate from circa 1810 to 1832.

Estimate: £400 - £600

### Condition Report

1265. The case is in generally good complete order but is a little tired with some veneers lifting/cracking to front of base, other minor veneer cracks and a crack across the arch. There is also a small piece of veneer missing from the front of base. All glass panels in good order, brass mounts a little worn. The painted dial with some crackle and minor losses. Small area of re-touching at 4 o'clock. Typical light discolouration and wear. The maker's lettering is a little faint. The eight day two-train quarter striking fusee movement striking hours and quarters on two bells is running well and functioning correctly. It would benefit from a clean/service.

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
