An Austro-Hungarian .800 silver enamelled and gem set pendant, last quarter of the 19th century, designed as St George slaying the dragon, weight 13.4g, width 3.2cm (the suspension loop and chain lacking).

Condition Report

515. It is quite dirty and would benefit from a professional clean. Top of loop connecting pearl is currently slightly open and needs to be closed up to make it secure. There is some wear to the enamel generally. No gems in the eyes of the horse, which are recessed suggesting at some stage there may have been. There is a loop on the top of the tail of the horse, there would have originally have been another loop on the top of the head of the horse but this has broken off long ago. There is some movement to the wings of the dragon, which pivot on their fittings, they have perhaps worked slightly loose. The gilding to the design is now rather weak. The green gem at the back of the horse is chipped. The Austro-Hungarian hallmarks are on the side of the tail.

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
