A pair of Chinese cloisonné vases, late Qing dynasty, of baluster form, each body modelled as lotus seeds emerging from the flower under a flared neck and bulbous mouth, decorated all-over with a polychrome lotus and scrolling tendril design bordering butterflies flying amidst flowers, the gilt circular foot with blue keyfret border, height 37.5cm (minor faults).

Estimate: £300 - £500

Condition Report

1205 - Vase 1 - generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. There are a few minor chips/losses to enamel on the mouth and neck of the vase and a small chip/loss to enamel on one of the flutes to the body. Typical light wear to gilt.

Vase 2 - dent and slight misshaping to rim above some loss to the enamel on the mouth. Some minor chips/losses to enamel on body but no other significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Typical wear to gilt and some minor pitting.
