A collection of Chinese porcelain and glass, Kangxi period and later, including a pair of famille rose export porcelain Buddhistic lion jostick holders, Qianlong period, length 11cm (lacking vase backs), two overlay two-colour glass snuff bottles, heights 6cm, a famille verte dish, Kangxi period, painted with figures, length 12.5cm, two blanc-de-Chine toy figures, Kangxi period, heights 5.6cm and 4.7cm, and various lids (the majority with faults).

Estimate: £100 - £200

Condition Report

1342 - The bowl of the pipe has chips around the rim and two hairline cracks. There is wear to enamels and gilt on bowl and the stem. The mouthpiece has been broken off as seen in the images.

Pair of Buddhistic lions - cracked, chipped and worn, missing vase backs.

Vase - damaged neck and missing section of rim.

Turquoise water dropper - repaired tail, chips to spout and wear.

Small white teapot - spout damages and repaired, chips to base.

Famille verte tray - broken in two and repaired with chips along break and rim.

Amethyst beaker - chip to rim, otherwise ok.

Blue overlay snuff bottle - chips and loss to overlay on one side, otherwise ok.

Red overlay snuff bottle - rim chipped and cracked, otherwise overlay and rest of bottle ok.

2 Blanc de chine figures - both with chips and minor losses

Other items mostly have condition issues - please ask if there is something specific which is not mentioned above.
