A Tibetan bronze stupa, probably 13th/14th century, of bell shaped form, the foliate finial above a ridged spire and gallery, on a turned tapered pedestal and double lotus moulded base, height 33cm.

Provenance: from the estate of a West Sussex collector.

Estimate: £600 - £1,000

Condition Report

1112 - Generally good condition, but dirty and would benefit from a clean. The bell shaped body in generally good order, but with typical surface scratches and wear commensurate with age. Some minor misshaping to the flame finials. Minor dents to the body and small hole just above the lotus base. Appears to be a small repair to one of the lotus leaves on the lower ring of the base. The underside base panel is worn and dented with a 5cm tear/split to its centre. Prayers visible to interior. The detachable spire fits the lower part but with some minor adaptation to the sleeve fitting, presumably original, but obviously cannot be certain. The spire with typical surface scratches, wear and slight misshapen knob. Minor dents and knocks. Weight 2435.5g.
