### LOT 1102

A group of six Tibetan bronze vajra, 18th/19th century, each end formed as a crown centred with a knob, various sizes, lengths ranging from 5.4cm to 20.5cm. Provenance: from the estate of a West Sussex collector.

### Condition Report

1102 - 1 - Length 20.5cm, width at widest point 4.4cm. Generally good condition but typical wear to highpoints and ends in particular. Some of the openwork crown uprights are a bit wobbly and loose, but are all present with the iron sections showing some signs of rust and wear.

2 - Length 13.8cm, width 3.2cm. Generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical wear particularly to highpoints.

3 - Length 13.7cm, width 3.6cm. Generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical wear and some minor scuffs and scratches.

4 - Length 9cm, width 2.6cm. Generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical surface scratches and wear, with some minor scuffs and scratches, minor misshaping to ends.

5 - Length 6.8cm, width 1.6cm. Generally good condition, some light surface wear to brown patina. Typical wear and scratches.

6 - Length 5.3cm, width 1.5cm. Generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical surface scratches and wear.
