A Tibetan copper teapot and domed cover, 19th century, the baluster body with partially gilded decoration, applied with a pair of dragon plaques within pierced borders, flanked by a dragon handle and spout, height 32cm, bearing Beasley Collection paper label to base, inscribed 'Tibet 507 3-6-36'. Provenance: from the estate of a West Sussex collector. Note: this teapot is illustrated in Alain Presencer's 'Tibetan Buddhist Art', item 12, page 79.

### Condition Report

1101 - The teapot is in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical surface wear and scratches, particularly to highpoints. Some wear to gilt. It is a little dusty and dirty, would certainly benefit from a clean. A few of the cabochons are chipped and worn.

Cover has some misshaping to inner rim and some small dents.
