A Tibetan thangka, late 19th/early 20th century, depicting Hwashang seated beside a table of offerings above a group of playful children, the lower left corner with the two guardians of the four directions, Virudhaka wielding the sword of the south and Dhritarashtra, the guardian of the east, playing a lute, 48cm x 36cm, the back printed in red with a stupa and script, mounted within a silk floral surround. Provenance: from the estate of a West Sussex collector.

Condition Report

1186. The painting is in generally poor condition with significant wear and some paint loss. There are creases including a significant vertical crease down the centre of the image. There is some rippling/misshaping to the panel and some staining visible. Silk surround with wear and fraying.
