A collection of Chinese porcelain, 18th and 19th century, including a famille verte teapot and cover, Kangxi period, painted with flowers, height 11.5cm (faults), a blue and white baluster vase, mark of Kangxi but late 19th century, painted with pheasant and flowers, height 22.5cm, a sang-de-boeuf vase, height 16.2cm (repaired rim), and an Imari export porcelain circular strainer dish, diameter 23.7cm (some faults).

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

1265. Famille verte teapot - missing handle, damaged spout, cover glued to body and converted to lamp base. Typical chips and wear.

Circular strainer - chips to rim and typical wear and scratches.

Blue bowl and cover - cover with crack and repaired section. Bowl in good order, but with typical wear.

Imari plate - hairline crack to rim and star crack to base, typical wear.

Imari bowl - two hairline cracks to rim, few minor rim chips and typical wear.

Flambe vase - repair to rim and chips to footrim, otherwise ok.

Gourd shaped bottle - scuffs to glaze on spout, otherwise ok.

Canton bottle vase - repaired neck and wear to decoration.

Blue and white vase - no cover, but otherwise in good condition.

Canton cylindrical box - cracked and chipped, cover with chips to rim.

Yellow dish - good condition.

Small yellow dish - small hairline, otherwise ok.

Small turquoise dish - good condition.

2 blue border saucers - good condition.
