A late Victorian silver mounted walnut inkstandish, the centre mounted with a stag's head flanked by a pair of acorn form inkwells with hinged lids and oak leaf bases, the rectangular walnut stand with a pair of pen depressions above a single frieze drawer, on ball feet, London 1897 by Peter Henderson Deere, height 30cm, length 32cm.

Condition Report

446. Generally in good condition but typical surface scratches and wear.

The silver stag's head is in good order but there is some wear and minor misshaping to its circular base and hallmarks are rubbed. Please note the central circular base is not a box and cover, it is just the plinth to the stag's head.

One of the acorn inkwells has a small lead repair to its stalk, otherwise inkwells in good condition with working hinges, typical minor dents, scratches and wear to bodies. No significant damage or repairs. Good clear hallmarks.

Wood stand in generally good order with typical scuffs, nicks and wear. Front of bottom panel is slightly warped. Typical light surface scratches and wear to silver handle and ball feet. Handle and feet not hallmarked.
