LOT 1132

A George IV mahogany longcase clock with eight day movement striking on a bell, the 13-inch painted breakarch dial with black Roman hour numerals, subsidiary seconds and date aperture, inscribed 'B. Popplewell Bridlington', within a green and gilt decorated surround, the hood with swan neck pediment, glazed door and reeded columns, the trunk with arched door and reeded cut corners, on a panelled base, height 230cm, with pendulum and two weights (lacking feet). Note: Benjamin Popplewell is a recorded Yorkshire clockmaker between 1823 and 1840.

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

1132 - The clock is in generally good restored condition. Case in generally good order but missing its feet. Hood is a little tight when sliding on and off. Small crack to glass on hood door in right hand corner. Case with typical minor splits and veneer splits commensurate with age. Dial is restored, bright and clean. Movement winds smoothly and the clock is running but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch. No wood worm.

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
