An impressive Edwardian mahogany longcase clock, the three train movement chiming quarters on eight tubular gongs and striking hours on a larger tubular gong, the foliate engraved brass breakarch dial with silvered chime selection and chime/silent subsidiary dials to arch, above a silvered chapter ring with black Roman hour numerals and outer Arabic minutes, framing a subsidiary seconds dial and applied silvered plaque, inscribed 'H. Osborn, Croydon', the hood with swan neck pediment above blind fretwork frieze, glazed door and fluted columns, the trunk with arched door flanked by brass stop fluted corner columns, on a paneled base and plinth, height 230cm, with pendulum, three brass weights and winder (some faults).

Condition Report

1190. The case has some typical scuffs, nicks etc, and will require some tidying up, but otherwise in generally sound condition. There have been repairs to the wood at the hinges of the hood door, and front panel to base is loose.

The seconds hand is missing and both of the minute and hour hands are broken. The dial is otherwise in generally good condition.

The movement winds and the clock runs, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch. The striking mechanism also working with chiming on quarters and strike on the hour.

Width of base 55cm, depth of base 37.5cm. There is also another surround to the base (like a faux plinth) which just sits around the base, but can be removed. With this in place the width is 60cm, depth is 40cm.

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
