### LOT 1369

A Ridgway porcelain sucrier and cover and matching jug, circa 1830, extensively gilt with fruiting vine and trellis against a pale apricot ground beneath a cobalt blue band, pattern No. 2/2547, together with a group of other porcelain tablewares, including a Yates jug and two plates, pattern No. 1201, diameter of plates 23.5cm, a Ridgway blue, lemon and gilt dish, pattern No. 2/6573, diameter 26cm, and a Daniel Shrewsbury dessert plate, moulded with fruiting vine, pattern No. 4359, diameter 22cm.

### Condition Report

Ridgway sucrier and cover - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, although there is some minor speckled misfiring to the apricot ground beneath one handle and some minor scratches, the cover has a haircrack visible to the underside primarily beneath the knob.

Ridgway jug - similar minor speckling to apricot ground around handle, short indistinct firing crack to rim on edge of spout, only visible to exterior on close inspection, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Yates pieces - jug with minor chip to exterior edge of foot and 1cm long horizontal firing crack to inner edge of spout, both plates with light wear and one with some manufacturing firing cracks visible to underside edge of well, otherwise all in good condition.

Blue, lemon and gilt dish - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Daniel plate - approx 4cm long haircrack to rim at 5 o'clock and minor nick to rim underside at 10 o'clock, typical minor and light scratches.

Spode rosebud plate - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Pair green ground plates - one with some minor crazing, otherwise both in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.
