## LOT 1535

A Linthorpe pottery vase, circa 1880, designed by Christopher Dresser, the green glazed ribbed cylindrical body applied with stems of flowers and foliage, impressed and incised marks to base with facsimile signature, height 22.5cm (restored), together with a Linthorpe Dresser bowl of pierced circular shape, decorated with orchid flowers and foliage, diameter 15cm, and a Linthorpe Dresser dish, relief decorated with peaches, length 13cm. Note: the bowl with orchids is illustrated by Widar HalÚn in 'Christopher Dresser', pl. 111.

## Condition Report

Vase - overall fine crazing to the glaze. There is a sizeable area of triangular shaped professional restoration running approx two thirds of the way around the top circumference of the vase and a third of the way down the body at its longest point - it sits mainly between two sections of applied flowers but does include some of the petals, stems and leaves. It is visible due to its colour difference and lack of crazing. There is a 1cm by 0.5cm glaze chip to the footrim and a much smaller similar nick.

Bowl - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. There is some minor crazing to the base interior. The glaze colours have run during manufacture.

Dish - there is a starcrack to the centre of the dish which is primarily visible to the underside, but once you know it is there you can make it out on the upper surface. No chips or restoration but some typical light wear to the enamels.
