### LOT 1550

A Minton's Art Pottery Studio circular charger, circa 1870, painted with a green beetle by white hydrangea against a blue ground, monogrammed, printed, painted and impressed marks to reverse, diameter 29cm, together with a Doulton Lambeth faience oval dish, painted with a kingfisher, length 34.6cm, and a Wedgwood pottery charger, decorated with a sunflower, diameter 25cm.

Estimate: £80 - £120

### Condition Report

Minton's charger - overall fine crazing to the glaze with a minor starcrack amidst the crazing visible to the underside. The enamelled surface generally in good condition with some scratches.

Kingfisher dish - overall fine crazing to the glaze with a 9cm long haircrack running from the rim at the base of the tree into the chest of the bird. 2.5cm long firing crack to very rim edge of upper surface at end where dragonfly painted.

Sunflower - In good condition overall with no cracks or restoration, a few minor glaze frits to rim edge and some deep scratches to upper surface.
