### LOT 1378

A Ridgway porcelain centrepiece, mid-19th century, the white glazed body decorated to the interior with flowers beneath the pierced gilt edged rim with foliate moulded handles, puce printed Royal arms mark to base with pattern No. 6409, diameter 33.5cm, together with an H. & R. Daniel shell pink ground centrepiece, circa 1825, first gadroon shape, painted with panels of fruit and flowers within gilt framing, painted pattern No. 3813, length 34cm (haircrack), and a small group of other English porcelain, including a Minton comport.

Estimate: £70 - £100

### Condition Report

White ground centrepiece - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration but the gilding is rubbed and there are light surface scratches to the upper surface.

Pink ground Daniel - crazing primarily to foot which has a 4cm fine haircrack, another 4.5cm long haircrack runs vertically through the central panel. Otherwise in good order with no real wear to enamels or gilding.

Minton comport - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Some minor crazing to the foot, the gilding and enamels in good order with no wear.

Two handled pot and cover - overall in good condition with fine crazing to the glaze, minor hairline amidst crazing to the underside edge of the foot. Gilding good.

Green ground Minton plate painted with ruins - minor haircrack between rim and piercing and wear to gilding of well.

Grey ground floral painted Ridgway plate - faint hairline to cavetto between 3 and 6 o'clock.

Grey ground Alcock plate painted with misty castle view - some crazing to glaze and slight discolouration to ground colour with some scratches.

Otherwise all the plates in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.
