### LOT 1368

A large Ridgway porcelain dessert centrepiece, circa 1845, painted to the centre with a basket of flowers within a pierced cobalt blue rim gilt and enamelled with foliate scrollwork, beneath scroll handles with floral terminals, raised on a similar decorated waisted stem and spreading foot, unmarked, diameter 34.5cm, pattern No. 5952, together with a matching pair of smaller comports, diameter 24cm, and a similar pair of botanically painted low-footed oval shaped dishes, puce painted factory marks, pattern No. 5596, length 29cm.

### Condition Report

The centrepiece and pair of comports are each in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. The gilding and enamels show little or no wear apart from on the rim of one of the smaller comports. The pair of oval dishes have no restoration but one has a small dig/chip to the upper rim edge and the other has 3 minor hairlines between the handle and its piercing. Both dishes display wear, light surface scratches and rubbing to the gilding.
