### LOT 1374

A Ridgway porcelain pierced fruit basket, circa 1830, pattern No. 2168, painted with a landscape scene of ruins beneath the pierced rim, printed in puce with trellis panels outlined with gilt scrollwork, unmarked, length 29cm, together with two matching plates, a pair of puce printed dishes with shell handles, probably Minton, length 24.8cm, a Davenport teacup and saucer and two plates, each with green printed floral decoration, pattern No. 1055, and a Ridgway plate. Note: one of the puce printed plates is illustrated by Geoffrey Godden in 'The Illustrated Guide to Ridgway Porcelain', pl. 72.

### Condition Report

Fruit basket - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, some very minor wear and light surface scratches.

Matching pair of plates - first in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, the second has no restoration or damage but is heavily scratched and with wear primarily to the cavetto.

Pair shell handled dishes - both in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, each has some minor surface scratches.

Teacup and saucer - glued chip to exterior rim edge of cup.

3 remaining plates - each in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, although each displays a little wear and/or surface scratches.
