### LOT 1379

A Derby porcelain scent bottle or diminutive vase, circa 1820, the pear shaped body painted in puce with a landscape view of a cottage flanked by gilt cornucopia against a cobalt blue ground, red painted mark to base, height 8.8cm, together with a floral painted example, probably Coalport, height 7cm, and a landscape painted example with beaded detail to the neck, Ridgway, height 8cm.

Estimate: £100 - £150

### Condition Report

Puce landscape - Typical fine crazing to glaze overall which has some minor staining to the rim. There is a vertical manufacturer's firing crack to the right side edge of the puce panel approx 1.5cm long which disappears into a faint haircrack and then into the crazing of the neck. There is another manufacturer's firing fault to the reverse of the vase at the widest part of the body in the form of a concave unglazed spot.

Otherwise in good condition overall with no restoration or chips, only very minor wear to gilding.

Floral example - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Typical very fine crazing to the glaze.

Beaded neck example - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Very fine crazing to the glaze and a few minor scratches to the decoration.
