A Minton majolica jug, mid to late 19th century, relief moulded with oval portraits of a train driver and a carriage driver beneath the inscription 'PRESENT, PAST, THE TWO DRIVERS', flanked by images of their transport modes, unmarked, height 23cm, together with a Wedgwood majolica caterer jug and a Brownfield jar and cover in the form of a sack of biscuits being eaten by two mice (faults and restoration).

Condition Report

PLEASE NOTE THIS IS A PARTIAL CONDITION REPORT ON THIS LOT ONLY INCLUDING THE MINTON JUG

Minton jug - approx 6cm long by 1cm high area of professional restoration to cobalt blue edge of foot in area directly beneath the spout. Two similar areas of professional restoration to the top rim edge, one approx 6cm long by 1cm deep above the date '1848', the other a smaller and narrower section to the edge of the spout. These areas only really noticeable on closer inspection and due to the fact the otherwise overall fine crazing to the glaze is not apparent here.
