LOT 1472

A small mixed group of predominantly English pottery and porcelain, late 18th, 19th and 20th century, including a pair of pearlware cupid candlesticks, height 20.5cm, two Wedgwood hippocampus oval shaped comport bases, length 30cm, two Spode Dragon pattern coffee cans, a New Hall coffee can, pattern No. 224, and a small group of assorted covers (faults, repairs and losses).

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

Botanical dish - small area of professional restoration to one end of dish above flowers, approx 3cm long, another area of professional restoration to underside through botanical name, but not seen to upper surface. Otherwise typical light crazing overall.

Pair Cupid candlesticks - both cut down around the tops of the heads and missing the sconces, each missing end of element held in right hand, both with a a few minor nicks to bases.

Creamware figure - number of significant chips to base edge, missing element from top as left with protruding metal fixing and wear to upper surface.

Yellow jug - large chip out of rim, majority of the pieces available with the lot - overall light surface wear.

2 eggcups - one visibly repaired through stem, both with signifiant losses to gilding.

2 Spode cans - one handle with crack and small spot of filling.

New Hall can - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Dish with dung beetles - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Large green cover - extensively professionally restored.

Staffordshire spaniel - firing hole to top of head, small chip to tail, crazed.

Chess piece decanter - ok

Pastille burner - one chimney detached but available with the lot, another chimney glued, overall cover quite chipped. Base with one replacement foot, 2 large chips and other smaller nicks to top rim edge and to one foot. Other covers - one very badly damaged, otherwise generally ok with some small chips

Hippocampus - both finely crazed, each with some long hairlines primarily visible to the underside, one with 2 large chips to top support and a small chip to one hoof, other with small chips to 2 hooves and one to top support.
