A mixed group of Minton Naturalist Service wares, circa 1870, designed by William Stephen Coleman in the Aesthetic style, based on Japanese prints and decorated with random arrangements of birds, fish, insects and plants, including a square shaped jardini@re and stand, height 18cm, a leaf shaped dish with moulded crab foot to the underside, length 21cm, three pierced rim plates, a circular stand and nine plates, various printed, painted and impressed marks (faults).

Estimate: £250 - £350

Condition Report

1512. The square jardini@re has several hairline cracks to the base and is crazed all over.

The stand has water damage to the interior, otherwise in good condition.

Each of the three plates with the pierced border either has a hairline crack or a small area of restoration, also crazed all over.

The circular stand (30.5cm diameter) has a restored crack to the rim approx 4cm, and also crazed.

The remaining plates have varying degrees of wear but no obvious chips or cracks.
