A Japanese Kutani koro and cover, Meiji period, the ovoid body painted with sparrows and blossoming branches beneath clouds and applied dragons to shoulders, the domed cover with Kylin finial, height 36.5cm (repaired finial and foot), together with a Japanese Fukagawa Koransha blue and white porcelain vase, painted with a landscape, height 23cm and a pair of Japanese Imari porcelain dishes, diameters 18cm and 18.5cm.

## Condition Report

1301. Kutani koro - one foot broken off and re-glued. One of the dragons has a restored horn to its head, the other has a small chip to a claw, otherwise the body of the jar is in good order with nice vibrant colours. Typical light surface scratches and wear. The Kylin finial has been broken off and repaired, otherwise cover in good order.

Koransha vase - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

Pair of dishes - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.
