A Chinese famille rose porcelain bowl, mark of Daoguang and possibly of the period, of steep sided circular form, painted with four figures beneath a gilt rim, iron red painted seal mark to base, diameter 10cm, together with two famille rose porcelain saucers, both mark of Qianlong but 20th century, diameters 11cm, a famille rose export porcelain hexagonal dish, a terracotta dish, a Japanese Imari dish and a Straits Chinese Peranakan or Baba-Nyonya famille rose circular dish, diameter 14.7cm (some faults).

Condition Report

1284. Bowl - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Wear to gilt rim, otherwise decoration is good and vibrant.

Turquoise saucer - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Minor surface scratches and wear.

Iron red border saucer - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Minor wear to gilt.

Hexagonal dish - 3 hairlines to rim, chips to rim and wear to enamels gilt and glaze.

Brown pottery dish - small chip to rim, otherwise ok.

Imari dish - generally ok, but a bit dirty with some wear to decoration and glaze.

Famille rose dish - 1.5cm hairline to rim and 1cm hairline to rim, otherwise minor wear to gilt rim and typical light surface scratches and wear to decoration.
