A Chinese famille verte 'month' wine cup/teabowl, mark of Kangxi and possibly of the period, of steep-sided 'U' form, one side finely enamelled with a blossoming and fruiting pomegranate tree, the reverse with underglaze blue ten-character poetic inscription and seal mark, underglaze blue six-character mark within double ring to base, height 4.9cm (cracked and repaired).

Estimate: £250 - £350

Condition Report

1128. U-shaped section of bowl has been broken out and re-glued, approx half of the rim with a depth of approx 3.5cm. Small hairline crack which continues on from the break (approx 1.5cm in length). Also another vertical hairline running down from the rim, approx 3cm in length. Some minor glue residue visible along breaks. Otherwise decoration is vibrant.
