A pair of Chinese famille rose porcelain rectangular plaques, late Qing dynasty, each with a central moulded panel painted with a peach tree in a pot, a bat flying above, within a surround of lotus and scrolling tendrils, within turquoise ground borders filled with flowers and scrolling tendrils, each 24cm x 11cm, framed as one (one cracked).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

Both plaques have been mounted as one in a wooden frame with no access to their backs.

The first plaque appears in good condition overall with no apparent cracks, chips or restoration. Typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels.

The second plaque has been broken into 4 pieces and repaired, with minor chips/losses along the break lines. Typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels.
