A small collection of Chinese porcelain and works of art, 18th century and later, including a blue and white globular teapot, painted with flowers, length 16.5cm (lacking cover), a famille rose yellow ground porcelain ginger jar and cover, mark of Qianlong but late Qing dynasty, painted with a design of lotus and tendrils, height 14cm (cover repaired and hairline to rim), and an export porcelain teabowl, painted in pink, iron red and gilt with opposing scenes of geese and pavilion with trees, all within underglaze blue and gilt borders, diameter 7.6cm.

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

Teapot - lacking cover. Otherwise generally in good condition with only tiny nicks to tip of spout and typical light surface scratches.

Yellow ground ginger jar - small hairline to rim approx 2.5cm, otherwise in generally good condition with typical light surface scratches and wear to enamels. Cover broken into 6 pieces and re-glued.

Famille rose teabowl with geese - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Minor wear to gilt and enamels.

Other famille rose teabowl - 4.5cm and 3cm hairlines to rim, numerous minor rim chips.

Turquoise buddhistic lion - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Blue and white paste pot and cover - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Soapstone brush washer - hairline crack, minor chips and minor repairs to leaves.

Gilt metal vessel - surface scratches and wear.

Wood stand - some typical wear and scratches.
