A Japanese cloisonné two-handled jar and cover, Meiji period, the ovoid body decorated with opposing panels, one side with a grey dragon against a dark blue ground, the reverse with polychrome ho-o bird on a royal blue ground, all reserved against a translucent green ground filled with polychrome kiku flowerheads and scrolling tendrils, flanked by a pair of similarly decorated arched upright handles, unsigned, height 25.5cm (dent and damage to one side of body).

Estimate: £300 - £500

Condition Report

The dragon panel side of the body is in good condition, with no significant damage or repairs, just typical light surface scratches. Unfortunately there is a dent with enamel loss to the other side with the majority of the enamel loss being the tail feathers of the Ho-o bird (please see the extra images on our website using the zoom function).

Otherwise the handles and foot in generally good order with typical light surface scratches and wear. The cover in generally good order but some minor enamel loss to underside of finial.
