A pair of Japanese Satsuma earthenware bottle vases by Choshuzan, Meiji period, each painted and gilt with a scene of rakan and moulded in relief with an entwined dragon, gilt signature to bases, height 15.5cm, with wood stands, together with a similarly decorated larger vase by Choshuzan, gilt and iron red signature to base, height 20.5cm (minor chips).

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

1133. Larger vase - generally good condition, minor chips to horns, beard and teeth of dragon. Typical light wear to gilt and enamels, typically slightly more pronounced on rim.

Smaller vase 1 - chip to footrim, chips to beard and horns of dragon, otherwise ok with typical surface wear to gilt, more pronounced on rim.

Smaller vase 2 - generally good order, but typical chips to beard and horns of dragon, typical surface scratches and wear to gilt, slightly more pronounced on rim.
