Provenance: purchased by Elizabeth & John Taylor from the Royal Academy exhibition in 1949, thence by descent. Note: the artist's son John Moynihan quoted his mother saying, 'What I remember more about that opening was Elizabeth Taylor, the novelist, coming in, literally out of the blue - her husband John Taylor was in the RAF and buying a painting. We became great friends and regularly corresponded from then on. References: N.H. Condition Report

41. Previously cleaned and restored. The most recent clean has left the varnish to the face and left hand side, unusually. Paint a little thin along the bottom edge and left hand side, but probably original rather than due to over-cleaning. The face looks like it may have had touches of overpainting, but this is not highlighted by UV. However, UV does highlight a small touched-in scratch to the bottom right, and other small areas to the background, particularly the top left and top right corners. Minor craquelure.

Frame with cracking to the composition, a small chip to the bottom left cresting and minor rubbing to extremities.
