An Edwardian silver mounted tortoiseshell diminutive timepiece, the French movement with platform escapement, the circular enamel dial with black Arabic numerals and inscribed 'Mappin & Webb', the case with piqué inlaid foliate scroll and festoon decoration to front beneath a cast ribbon bow and floral festoon surmount, on scroll feet, London 1909 by William Comyns, height 10.3cm.

## Condition Report

420 - Generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. A little bit dirty so would certainly benefit from a clean. All the silver is present with no missing pieces. Minor dent to back door and some misshaping/dents to back feet. Typical surface scratches and wear. The tortoiseshell panels have typical light surface scratches and wear but no significant damage. One side panel slightly loose to one corner. The movement has an internal winder and winds and adjusts smoothly. It is currently running but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch. The dial in generally good order, some light rubbing to inscription.
