An early Victorian Scottish ebonized mantel clock with eight day twin fusee movement striking hours on a bell, the square silvered dial with black Roman hour numerals, engraved foliate scrolls and inscribed 'J & W Mitchell Glasgow', the backplate similarly signed, the ebonized case of rectangular form with bevelled glass panels to top and sides, on a cushion shaped base and rectangular plinth, height 32.2cm, with pendulum, winding key and case key. Note: John & William Mitchell are recorded Glasgow clockmakers working from Buchanan Street circa 1835 and Argyle Street circa 1820-60.

Estimate: £700 - £1,000

Condition Report

1120. The clock is in generally good restored condition with no significant damage. The case has had some re-touching to the ebonizing and a replacement section of veneer to left hand side of back door (see image 3 on our website). Typical restored shrinkage cracks visible to top and side veneers. The dial is in good order. Glass in good condition. Movement winds smoothly and strike mechanism operates as it should, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.
