## LOT 1176

A late 18th century oak longcase clock with thirty hour movement striking on a bell via an outside countwheel, the 10-inch square brass dial with single hand, the centre engraved with a landscape framing a silvered subsidiary date dial, the silvered chapter ring with black Roman hour numerals and inscribed 'Js Stratton Hampton', the hood with moulded pediment, glazed door and turned columns, the trunk with rectangular door above a plain base, height 203cm, with pendulum and weight (some faults). Note: James Stratton was a recorded Gloucestershire clockmaker working in Minchinhampton from 1765 to 1781.

Estimate: £80 - £120

## Condition Report

1176. The clock is a marriage, i.e. the movement and case did not start life together. The movement appears to be intact, but very dirty and would require service for it to run. Incorrect winding pulley. Pendulum has been modified with cut sides and weight has been modified. Dial is ok, but hands are not original. Case has been reduced and lower plinth missing. Trunk door lock is faulty and no key. Top panel of hood replaced.
