### LOT 1434

Two rare cold painted English saltglaze brown stoneware jugs, circa 1770, each with a spun grooved neck and applied reeded strap handle, one with a gilt edged oval cartouche, painted with huntsmen and hounds outside an inn, the other with a shaped cartouche, painted in the manner of Seymour with a hunt, height 21cm (some faults).

Estimate: £200 - £300

### Condition Report

Hunting Scene - approx 1.5 by 1cm flat chip to underside edge of foot with other minor nibbles to edge of foot. Some flaking to enamels of painted scene, some areas of which have been sympathetically repainted, and wear to gilding. Minor glaze chip to lower handle terminal. 2cm long narrow chip to neck rim edge and two other much smaller minor nibbled chips to neck rim edge.

Inn Scene - 2 small chips to underside edge of foot and inconsequential areas of glaze loss to edge of foot. Some minor sympathetic repainting to some of the flaked areas of the enamelled scene, which also has worn gilding. Minor glaze chip to lower handle terminal.
