LOT 1483

A Burmantofts Faience art pottery vase, late 19th century, of high-shouldered form with gently flared neck, the reddish brown glazed body with running and streaked green and yellow glazes, impressed marks to base, height 29.5cm, together with a similarly glazed Burmantofts double-gourd shaped vase, height 17.5cm, and a green glazed example (faults).

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

Large vase - heavily crazed overall with some small areas of glaze loss to the edge of the foot. The surface of the glaze also has some noticeable scratches and a particularly noticeable long craze/hair line running from the widest part of the body at a small angle down into the body of the vase for approx 30cm.

Small red vase - overall crazing to the glaze with scratches to the widest parts of the lower bulb, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Green vase - overall crazing to the glaze, large chip approx 2.5cm long by 1cm deep to the neck rim with two other much smaller chips to the underside rim edge.
