A Clichy scrambled millefiori paperweight, circa 1850, with an assortment of canes, including a rose, diameter approx 7cm, together with a similar smaller example, diameter approx 4.5cm, and an example set with barber's pole canes, diameter approx 5cm (faults and polishing).

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

Largest Clichy - the height of the dome is good but the proximity of the canes to the edge of the dome around the sides suggest it has been polished in this area. Otherwise in good condition with typical light surface scratches/scuffs commensurate with age.

Smaller Clichy - the base edge of the footrim has been noticeably extensively polished with the remains of a large chip visible where there is an uneven area and an approx 2cm long noticeable internal fracture. The surface of the dome is a good height but has a large number of small digs/scuffs commensurate with age and a couple of tiny internal bruises.

Barber's Pole - the dome has been visibly polished resulting in a very flat surface and an overall uneven shape. There are still noticeable digs/scratches overall, particularly in one patch to the upper surface.
