### LOT 1461

A Staffordshire porcelaineous dog inkwell, circa 1830-40, modelled as a bitch and her puppy by a kennel on a green mound base, height 9cm, together with a Samuel Alcock model of a poodle, impressed '252' to base, a Staffordshire group of a black and brown spaniel puppy on a mound base, and other Staffordshire dog and sheep models (some faults and restoration).

Estimate: £80 - £120

### Condition Report

Pair of large poodles - both typically crazed, dog facing right with small chip to snout, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Dog facing left in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, some very light staining and an indistinct glazed over manufacturing flaw to the snout. Sheep with tree behind - not a spill vase, missing end of one branch, typically crazed.

Ram with tree behind - not a spill vase, typically crazed, very minor staining around edge of base, missing end of one tree branch.

Dog with kennel - typically crazed otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Some flaking to enamels.

Dogs in basket - typically crazed, missing handles of basket and tail of one puppy.

Black and brown dog group - a number of long craze lines with minor indistinct staining.

Dog on yellow mound base - one large chip and two small nicks to base edge which also has 3 vertical haircracks which have some minor staining.

Pair dogs on green bases - both heavily crazed, dog facing left in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Dog facing right with large crack and small chip to base and glaze flake to nose.

Large standing sheep - tiny nick to right ear, firing crack to one leg.

Five smaller sheep - one badly restored, one with some staining to the base, others in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.
