A set of six Bloor Derby topographical plates, circa 1840, painted by Daniel Lucas, each with a named view, comprising 'View in Scotland', 'Hawthornden Scotland', 'Ullswater From Pooly (sic) Bridge', 'Aivey Force Cumberland', 'Fingals Cave Island of Staffa' and 'Matlock High Tor Derbyshire', within gilt overlaid cobalt blue rims with gadrooned edging, red printed factory marks to reverse with script titles, diameter 22cm.

Condition Report

Ullswater view - small chip to underside rim edge not really visible from the front. Heavily crazed.

Scotland - approx 1.5cm long vertical hairline to rim at 12 o'clock, primarily visible to underside. Heavily crazed.

Matlock - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Small area of wear to gilding on rim around 7 o'clock.

Cumberland - heavily crazed, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Hawthornden - heavily crazed, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Cave - heavily crazed, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.
