A J.M. Michel Cazin pottery vase, circa 1900, the blue glazed bulbous body decorated in high relief with daisy flowers and leaves, applied rectangular plaque with incised mark, height 14cm.

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

There are a number of areas around the circumference of the vase where the glaze is not uniform in its coverage, leaving slightly indented patches with no glaze, this likely happened during the manufacturing process, though resembles glaze flaking/chipping. However, some of these areas appear to have been later touched up with a similar coloured paint, possibly an amateur attempt at restoration.

The biggest area affected is on the right side of the incised mark in the top half of the vase, which has some patches, approx 2-3 cm in length.

To the immediate left of the incised mark there are a couple of small chips to the edge of one leaf, there is another chip to the inner edge of the top rim.

General crazing overall.
