LOT 1591

A group of 19th century and later decorative ceramics, including a Bloor Derby lobed dessert dish, painted with a 'View of Italy', width 24.7cm, a set of five Brown-Westhead, Moore & Co plates, each painted with a floral spray, and a pair of Worcester style plates decorated with panels of exotic birds against a cobalt blue scale ground (minor faults and restoration).

Estimate: £40 - £60

Condition Report

View in Italy dish - heavily crazed with poorly filled restoration to one scroll edge of handle and approx 5cm long vertical hairline crack to rim, decoration ok.

Set 5 plates - one with minuscule nick to underside rim edge, one broken into a number of pieces and heavily (visibly) restored, one with amateur glued repairs to rim, one with restoration to rim, one in good condition. Pair Worcester style plates - both heavily crazed, one with minor hairline to rim amidst piercing.

Pink rosebud plate - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Printed jug - stained with repaired handle.

Imari jug - crazed with short hairline crack to rim.

Blue scale ground bowl - crazed with chip to rim.

Floral circular stand - gilt rim worn, lightly crazed.

Derby blue and gilt sucrier - missing handles and cover.

Pink rosebud teacup - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Derby blue ground teacup - cracked and worn with riveted handle.

Cobalt blue ground saucer - starcrack.

Basket - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

House money box - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Miniature service pieces - 2 of the oval dishes chipped, otherwise crazed but ok.

Blue scale oval dish - crazed but ok.
