### LOT 1420

Fourteen white feldspathic stoneware relief moulded jugs, 19th century, with various coloured grounds, including two Mayer examples, decorated with Paul and Virginia, a Mayer Convolvulus example and one by Dudson with pineapple and fruiting vine decoration (some faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

### Condition Report

Cobalt blue ground with putti amidst vines - small filled chip to exterior rim edge on side of spout.

Cobalt blue ground with cherubs and fauns - small chip to thumb rest of handle, lower handle terminal and edge of foot, all quite indistinct.

Light blue with pineapples and vines - heavily crazed with staining, small haircrack beneath lower handle terminal.

Green ground with wheat - crazed with some staining.

Chocolate brown ground with strap work - indistinct hairline to lower handle terminal.

Grey ground with vine - two very small chips to base edge, similar small nick to top of handle, overall light brown speckled staining to relief decoration, approx 4cm long horizontal hairline to neck interior.

Grey ground bark moulded - missing pewter lid, indistinct crack to upper handle terminal, chip to thumb rest of handle, minor nicks to base edge, two small nicks amidst moulded decoration of stems, light brown staining.

Remaining items in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.
