An English Delft circular bowl, second half 18th century, probably Liverpool, painted to the base interior with a flowering peony within a chain border, the rim with a geometric band, diameter 27cm, together with a pearlware plate, painted in blue with a chinoiserie figure holding a parasol (faults).

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

Bowl - typical fritted chipping to whole of rim circumference. Small chip to footrim. Overall craze lines with a more prominent craze line approx 4cm long beneath central decoration. Manufacturing flaw to top leaves of central decoration.

Plate - crack to rim at 6 o'clock and 11 o'clock, rim heavily stained with overall fritting to edge and small chips, surface with some scratches.
