## LOT 501

An opal and diamond necklace, circa 1920, the front of floral and foliate wreath form with a tied bow surmount, the sides with bow motifs and foliate terminals, the centre mounted with a drop shaped opal within a surround of cushion cut diamonds, otherwise set with cushion and rose cut diamonds, on a bar and oval link neckchain with a boltring clasp, the back numbered '27059', length 41cm, with a case.

Estimate: £1,000 - £1,500

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## Condition Report

The black opal has an attractive play-of-colour. There is a natural flaw reaching the surface halfway down the left hand side of the opal. There are also one or two other tiny surface nicks. At the back of the opal there is some evidence of the host rock.

The diamonds generally are attractive white stones but one or two are slightly drawing colour. Clasp in working order and overall in good condition. The case is most likely original to the piece.

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
